FIRE PERMIT

PRIOR TO ANY BURNING CALL 829-2217

*****Burn dates are March 1st through June 15th and October 4th through December 15th.*****

No burning is allowed from December 16th through February 28th and from June 16th through October 4th due to weather related conditions.

During fire season (July 15th through October 4th) Molalla Fire District has the **authority to prohibit agricultural burning** when there is a bona fide fire danger. If any two factors apply, Molalla Fire District will issue a Fire Danger Burn Ban.

Predicted temperature 85 degrees or higher

Predicted humidity of 25% or less

Predicted winds 10 MPH or higher

Burn piles greater than 10'X10' require a "Special Burning Permit" issued by Molalla Fire District

What type of burning is allowed within the Fire District: (see definitions page)

Within Three (3) miles of the Molalla City Limits or inside the special DEQ control area:

Back Yard Debris

Back Yard burning, including a burn barrel or incinerator, may be conducted with a valid Fire permit. Burning may only be conducted on days approved by DEQ and Molalla Fire District

Construction & Demolition

Construction and Demolition Material open burning is **prohibited**.

Outside Three (3) miles of the Molalla City Limits or outside of the special control area:

Domestic

Domestic open burning, including a burn barrel or incinerator, with a valid Fire permit. Burning may only be conducted on days approved by DEQ and Molalla Fire District

Construction & Demolition

Construction or Demolition open burning may be conducted with a valid Fire permit. Burning may only be conducted on days approved by D.E.Q. and Molalla Fire District.

GENERAL BURNING PROHIBITIONS:

As per DEQ regulations, the following materials may not be burned at any time: clothing, wet garbage, plastic, wire, insulation, automobile parts, asphalt, petroleum treated materials, rubber products, animal remains or animal or vegetable matter resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking or service of food, or of any other material which normally emits dense smoke or noxious odors.

No person shall cause or allow to be initiated or maintained any open burning during hours not authorized by D.E.Q. and/or the local fire jurisdiction.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

Open burning shall not be conducted within 50' of any structure or other combustible material. (2010 OFC 307.4)

Exception 1. Not less than 15' when burning is conducted in an approved burning device.

Exception 2. Not less than 25' when pile size is 3' or less in diameter and 2' or less in height.

A garden hose connected to a water supply or other approved fire-extinguishing equipment **shall be readily available** for use at open burning sites.

Burning material shall be **constantly attended** by a person knowledgeable in the use of the fire-extinguishing equipment required by Sec 307.5 of the 2010 OFC and be familiar with the permit limitations which restrict open burning. An attendant shall supervise the burning material until the fire has been extinguished.

Molalla Fire District is authorized to require that open burning be immediately discontinued if atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous. (2010 OFC 307.1.1, & 307.3). The offence(s) may be referred to DEQ for further action.

Recreational Fires

Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread to within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition. (2010 OFC 307.4.2)

During the burn season (June 15th through October 14th) a special permit will be required for recreational fires.

The Fire Code official is authorized to order the extinguishment of open burning creates or adds to a hazardous situation (OFC 307.3)

DEFINITIONS:

Agricultural Waste – any organic material actually generated or used by an agricultural operation (an operation, for profit or raising, harvesting and selling crops, livestock or poultry. This does not include open field burning or the construction and use of dwellings customarily provided in conjunction with the agricultural operation.

Back Yard Debris: Dry material consisting of untreated wood, needles, leaves or plant materials grown on the property where burning is to take place.

Commercial Waste – materials from offices, wholesale or retail yards and outlets, warehouses, restaurants, mobile home parks and dwellings containing more than four family living units.

Construction Waste – any raw wood material actually resulting from or produced by a building or construction project.

Demolition Waste – (also land clearing) – any material actually resulting from or produced by the complete or partial destruction or tearing down of any man-made structure or the clearing of a site for land improvement or cleanup, excluding yard debris (domestic waste) and agricultural waste.

Domestic Waste – paper, cardboard, yard debris, or other material actually generated in or around a dwelling of four or fewer family living units that does not generate a black, foul or noxious smoke or odor and does not fall under the prohibited materials list on the top of this page. NOTE: If the waste is removed from the property of origin, it becomes commercial waste.

Industrial Waste – any material including process waste, produced as the direct result of any manufacturing or industrial process.

Letter Permit – an Air Contaminant Discharge Permit issued by the Department of Environmental Quality.

Local Fire Permit – a permit to burn issued by the governing local fire agency.

Open Field Burning – the burning of any perennial grass seed field, annual grass seed field or cereal grain field in such a manner that combustion air and combustion products are not effectively controlled.

Slash – forest debris or woody vegetation to be burned under the Oregon Smoke Management Plan administered by Oregon Department of Forestry. The burning of such slash is related to the management of forestland and does not include the burning of any other material created by any land clearing.

Special Control Area: Any area within three miles of a city boundary with a population greater than 1,000 but less than 45,000 or any area within 6 miles of a city boundary with a population of greater than 45,000 people.

Molalla Fire District has authority to control & extinguish any fire and investigate the existence of suspected or reported fires that may be hazardous to people, property or environment –2010 OFC 307.3, 104.10.1 and 104.11

Molalla Fire District may recover costs associated with suppressing unlawful fire – ORS 478.965

Open burning in compliance with regulations does not exempt any person from civil or criminal liability for consequences or damages resulting from such burning.
